

## STANDARDISED PRICE LIST

All funeral directors are legally required to publish this Price List for a standardised set of products and services. This is to help you think through your options and make choices, and to let you compare prices between different funeral directors (because prices can vary).

<b>ATTENDED FUNERAL (Funeral Charges Only) (Excludes local cremation or burial fee)</b>	<b>£995</b>
<i>This is a funeral where family and friends have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person at the same time as they attend their burial or cremation</i>	
Taking care of all legal and administrative arrangements	<i>Included</i>
Collecting and transporting the deceased person from the place of death (normally within 15 miles of the funeral directors premises) into the funeral director's care	<i>Included</i>
Care of the deceased person before the funeral in appropriate facilities. ( <i>the deceased person will be kept at the funeral director's local branch premises</i> )	<i>Included</i>
Viewing of the deceased person for family and friends, by appointment with the funeral director ( <i>where viewing is requested by the customer</i> )	<i>Included</i>
Provision of a suitable coffin ( <i>made of manufactured wood with a wood effect veneer</i> )	<b>£395</b>
At a date and time you agree with the funeral director, taking the deceased person direct to the agreed cemetery or crematorium (normally within 20 miles of the funeral director's premises) in a hearse or other appropriate vehicle	<b>£230</b>

<b>UNATTENDED FUNERAL</b>	
<i>This is a funeral where family and friends may choose to have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person, but they do not attend the burial or cremation itself.</i>	
Burial (funeral directors charges only) (EXCLUDES local burial fee)	<b>£995</b>
Cremation (funeral directors charges INCLUDING the cremation fee)	<b>£1295</b>

<b>FEES YOU MUST PAY</b>	
The typical cost of the burial fee for residents at Western Cemetery, for an Attended or Unattended burial funeral, This fee (which is sometimes called the interment fee) is the charge made for digging and closing a new grave, or for reopening and closing an existing grave. <i>For an existing grave with a memorial in place, you may need to pay a removal/replacement fee. In addition, the cemetery may charge a number of other fees.</i>	<b>£1940</b> <i>for a new 2 depth grave</i>
For an Attended cremation funeral, the cremation fee. In this local area, the typical cost of a cremation at Barry Crematorium is	<b>£875</b>

<b>ADDITIONAL FUNERAL DIRECTOR PRODUCTS AND SERVICES</b>	
This funeral director may be able to supply a range of optional, additional products and services, or to arrange (on your behalf) for a third party to supply them. Examples include:	
Additional transfers of the deceased person's body (e.g. to their home, place of worship etc.)	<b>£120</b>
Embalming	<b>£150</b>
Funeral officiant	Religious <b>£86</b> Humanist <b>£180</b> celebrant <b>£180</b>
limousine	<b>£160</b>

The funeral director can give you a full list of what they can supply. They are likely to charge for these additional products and services, so you may choose to take care of some arrangements without their involvement, or you can use a different supplier.
